Common Core Appropriations

 \$1 billion in one time Prop 98 dollars to be apportioned to local educational agencies (LEA) on a per average daily attendance (ADA) basis, using 2012-2013 P-2 enrollment.

OCUSD will receive approximately 4.9 million to be spent between 2013-2015

What Does The Spending Plan Include?

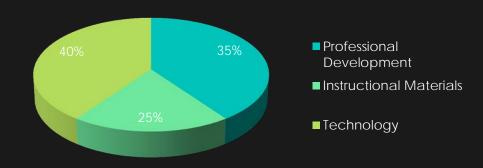
- Professional development for teachers, administrators, and paraprofessional educators or other classified employees involved in the direct instruction of pupils that is aligned to the academic content standards.
- Instructional materials aligned to the academic content standards.
- Integration of these academic content standards through technology-based instruction for purposes of improving the academic performance of pupils, including, but not necessarily limited to, expenditures necessary to support the administration of computer-based assessments and provide high-speed, highbandwidth Internet connectivity for the purpose of administration of computerbased assessments.

The Stages of Implementation of CCSS

- The Awareness Phase : introduction to the CCSS, the initial planning of systems implementation, and establishment of collaborations.
- The Transition Phase: concentration on building foundational resources, implementing needs assessments, establishing new professional learning opportunities, and expanding collaborations between all stakeholders.
- The Implementation Phase expands the new professional learning support, fully aligns curriculum, instruction, and assessments, and effectively integrates these elements across the field.

CCSS Strategies Carousel Training for Elementary schools (October to January) The carousel is a four part series of trainings on Common Core strategies to be held at 8 sites simultaneously: Topics are:

- Text Dependent Questioning/Text Based Evidence
- Collaborative Grouping/Active Participation

Academic Language Close Reading/Wide Angle

Reading

All teachers in Elementary will implement the four strategies demonstrated in the Carousel training.

The Roadshow is an inquiry process whereby teachers will analyze assessment questions/ smarter balanced questions needing constructive responses or performance based tasks. This is held once a month and the goals to analyze the skills that each of the responses will require and draw strength from one another. The feedback has been very positive.

We have administered 2 Writing Assessment using the Performance Task format.

Progress towards Common Core

 We are administering monthly assessments following the constructed response format. The outcome and student responses are discussed and analyzed during the Roadshow. We started with 5 questions and by March the number will be 20 in preparation of the CASPP -California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress
