Phonemic Awareness: /j/ Point to and say jet emphasizing /j/. Have children point to jet and repeat. Have children place a marker on the picture. Ask children to tell a partner which pictures begin with /j/ and to place a marker on them. Then have them listen to the Sound Pronunciation Audio.

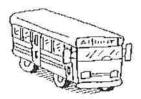


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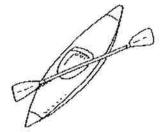


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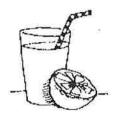

Grade K Unit 8 Week I **Phonics:** /j/j Point to and say jam emphasizing /j/. Have children repeat. Guide them to write j next to the jam. Have children write j next to each picture whose name begins with /j/. Ask them to tell the picture names beginning with j to a partner. Then display **Word-Building Card** j and use **Photo Cards** beginning with letter j to reinforce /j/j.

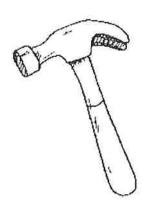
